INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

The style and format of your contribution must strictly adhere to the instructions detailed here. Please liaise closely with the Editor regarding the title, content and emphasis of your chapter.

Copyright

By submitting a manuscript to the editor or publisher you are deemed to have granted permission to publish the manuscript. You will also be required to assign copyright to the publisher. You are strongly advised **not** to use any figure or table that has been published previously. If you do, you must provide a "Permissions Form" signed by the original publisher. The signed form must be enclosed with your manuscript. You can download a copy of this form from: <http://www.horizonpress.com/authors>

Size

Please adhere to the instructions of the Editor regarding the size of your contribution. If no specific indication of size has been given, each chapter should be a maximum of 20,000 words plus figures and tables.

English

Manuscripts must be in perfect English. If English is not your first language please have your work corrected by someone who has English as their first language.

Title

The title of your contribution will be agreed with the Editor.

Running title

Please supply a running title of no more than 50 characters.

Abstract

Each chapter must include an abstract. Abstracts should be 100-200 words.

Headings

Headings should be at the left margin, lower case and in **bold** type. Sub-headings should be at the left margin, lower case and in *italics*. Sub-sub-headings should be at the left margin, lower case and in plain text.

Figures

We accept PDF, JPEG, Powerpoint, Photoshop. Ensure that the files are saved at highest quality possible (>300 dpi). Figure legends should be supplied in the main text file.

Colour Figures

Colour figures are not recommended due to the high cost of printing. If you supply colour figures you may be asked to contribute to the cost. Please ask your editor for details.

Tables

Number (Table 1, etc) in order of mention in the text.

References

References should be cited in the text in parentheses as follows (Goncalvez et al., 2010; Kennedy and Oswald, 2011).

The reference list should be in alphabetical order. Follow the style indicated:

Article in a journal:

Chambers, J.P., Arulanandam, B.P., Matta, L.L., Weis, A., and Valdes, J.J. (2008). Biosensor recognition elements. *Curr. Issues Mol. Biol.* 10, 1-12.

Chapter in a book:

Goncalvez, A.P., Purcell, R.H., and Lai, C.-J. (2010). Progress in passive immunotherapy. In *Frontiers in Dengue Virus Research*, K.A. Hanley and S.C. Weaver, eds. (Norfolk, UK: Caister Academic Press), pp. 265-297.

An entire book:

Kennedy, S., and Oswald, N. (2011). *PCR Troubleshooting and Optimization: The Essential Guide* (Norfolk, UK: Caister Academic Press).

In particular please note:

- (1) The use of punctuation in the authors' names and initials.
- (2) There is no space between an author's initials. (For example: Chambers, J.P., **NOT** Chambers, J. P.,)

Users of *EndNote* or *Reference Manager* should adopt the reference style of the journal "**Cell**" which is identical to ours.

The reference section should include only papers that are published or in press. Unpublished or submitted work should be cited in the text, as follows (J.R. Martins, unpublished). It is the responsibility of the authors to obtain permission for personal communications and a letter of permission should be enclosed with the manuscript.

Deadline

Completed manuscripts must be received by the editor by the Submission Date set by the editor.

Submission

Submit manuscripts directly to the Editor. When your manuscript has been fully accepted and any requested changes or corrections have been made, the authors should send the final manuscript to the editor. We can accept most word processing formats (eg Word, RTF, rich text format) but **do not** send the text as a PDF file. Figures should be supplied as PDF, JPEG, Powerpoint, or Photoshop at the highest possible quality (>300 dpi). The final quality of your printed figures cannot be greater than the quality supplied by the author. Please save figures as the highest quality possible (>300 dpi) even if this results in very large files.
